BRANDON ESSIG CO-AUTHORS TAMPA BAY TIMES ARTICLE ON MILITARY JUSTICE SYSTEM

Lightfoot Partner Brandon Essig co-authored a Tampa Bay Times article with Steven Arango, Marine Corps judge advocate and prosecutor at Base Quantico. The article, titled “**The military justice system has problems. Here’s how to fix them.**,” explores the disconnect between the federal and military justice systems’ resources, funding, staffing and presumed role.
